## DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This production was originally meant to go up in 2020. It was in a different church, with a different cast, in what felt like a different world. But in (roughly) 427 years of this play's existence, what is five years?

Like most things in this play, it's everything and nothing.

Much Ado About Nothing in many ways is about the small things that take on lives of their own. A misheard conversation. Grudges and egos that can't be let go of. Jokes and pranks not everyone finds funny. Somehow these micro moments lead to hook ups, break ups, engagements, scandals, funerals; they lead to laughter, dancing, screaming, and tears.

Much Ado is a beautiful reminder our lives can be enough to be the center of a great story. Something as simple as time with loved ones can be worthy of Shakespeare's time and words. People dismissed as silly or sour are more important in our lives than we imagined. Even when everything falls apart on a Tuesday, life can be great again by Thursday.

After preparing this show five years ago, and imagining it in the years since, it has been a wonderful and bizarre experience to finally be in rehearsal. It is different from what I imagined in 2020; for every moment of struggle or waiting, I wouldn't have it any other way. Like in the play, things have worked out the way they were meant to.

We walked into 2025 casting with the goal of shaping this production around the people we cast. This ensemble is full of bold and energetic people excited to share this story with you, and that guided this show. It is a treat to have them look you in the eye, ask questions and want your answers, mutter their side commentary to you and your seat mate, or offer you a hand for a dance. With such a warm and welcoming cast, it's our hope that you find a moment in this play to not only watch the story but experience it. To join them in a way you didn't expect. At least for the next two- and a-bit hours, it is our hope that the outside world may fade away and you can revel in life's small moments with us. To make some ado over what may be nothing, and let it feel like everything.






Semaj Kelly (Don Pedro) is making his


