The Aurpuse of The Alay

The pen is mightier than the sword...

...and this proves particularly true in Shakespeare's Henry VIII. In a play with no sword fights, no wars, and no bloodshed, the most powerful men and women in the world rise and fall through pen-strokes and word-of-mouth. As the alternate title (All is True) implies, the notion of what is fact and what is fiction pervades this play, and rumor runs rampant as political factions vie for power. The subjects of gossip range from high treason to marital infidelity, and the tellers of these stories run from the lowest members of court to the King of England himself. In our modern world where social media creates a melting pot of the opinions of users regardless of social standing, the impact of truth versus fabrication appears as relevant as ever.

I was inspired by the hit TV and book series Bridgerton to blend design elements of past and present to ease some of the anxiety of the audience around seeing a "king number play" and highlight the timelessness of the lessons that history teaches us.
